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
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
Our best family winter hikes

Experience the peaceful mountain scenery around Hotel Singer during a relaxed winter hike. The region has a lot to offer to non-skiers in winter – whether on the romantic Biligrundweg trail or with the whole family on Heiterwanger Hochalm pasture. Enjoy the unspoilt nature of Berwang and go on a discovery tour.

Heiterwanger Hochalm – heavenly views

Start your hike at the B-Active Center right in the heart of the Berwang ski area. Follow the signs to Hochalm pasture between the Obere Karbahn and Egghof Sunjet lifts, where the path leads you directly along the slope. Keep left at the crossing which also leads to "Das View" and continue into the direction of "Hochalm – Grünwaldquellenweg" after the next bend. Follow the trail that leads you up to the pasture in serpentines.





Biligrundweg – romantic forest trail

Start your hike at the tourist office, pass Hotel Kaiserhof, and continue on to the riding stables. Then keep to the right and follow the "Biligweg – Hochalm" signs through the forest. At the highest point, you could go left towards Hochalm – but you keep to the right. After leaving the forest, you can either continue to the left in the direction of "Das View" or descend to the right towards Berwang and finish the circular trail.



WALKING TIME: APPROX. 3.5 HOURS TRAIL LENGTH: 11.5KM SUITABLE FOR PRAMS AND STROLLERS

Mitteregg – culinary experiences

At the western end of Berwang, start your hike at the church and then hike along the country road to Mooslift. From there, a cleared and gritted winter hiking trail leads to the village of Rinnen. Follow the road through Rinnen past the ski lift, then at the end of the village a path branches off to the right in the direction of "Klemen – Namlos". Follow this path through the forest and continue for a short distance on the country road with little traffic. After a couple of metres, the trail starts again on the left side of the road and there is one last climb before you reach Mitteregg, also known as the "end of the world". We recommend stopping by at Wechner's Jausenstation for a little breather and tasty game from their own hunt.

For less experienced winter hikers, we recommend starting in Rinnen, where you can park your car at the Rinnerlift.

THE ZUGSPITZE

Even though it's easy to reach from Austria, Mt Zugspitze is Germany's highest mountain. It's about 15 minutes by car to the valley station in Ehrwald, where one of the most spectacular cable cars in the Alps takes you up to the summit. From there, you get to enjoy a majestic view over the Alps to Munich. Especially on clear days, the 360-degree panoramic view of more than 400 snow-covered Alpine peaks exceeds all expectations.



TYROLEAN SHALE OIL – THE HEALING HERITAGE OF THE SEA

For more than 110 years, the Albrecht family from Pertisau at Lake Achensee has been producing Tyrolean shale oil.



It all began when Martin Albrecht Senior discovered a special oil shale on Mt Seeberg in 1902. This oil shale is still mined today by the Albrecht family in the Karwendel mountains – at 1,500m above sea level – and processed into Tyrolean shale oil.

For our body, minerals are one of the most valuable active substances of nature. Tyrolean shale oil, which is extracted from the slate rock at Lake Achensee, is no exception. The active ingredients found in this oil and stone come from pre-historic marine animals and plants. Due to its unique composition and its high content of naturally bound sulphur, Tyrolean shale oil is extraordinarily beneficial and nurturing.





We use it in our Singer's SPA especially because of its many health benefits. It relaxes body and mind, improves well-being, and gives energy. Let yourself be pampered by our SPA team with Tyrolean shale oil – to regenerate after skiing adventures or after a winter hike:

Skiing in Berwang – past and present

Skiing and Tyrol go together like snow and winter. This is THE reason for spending winter holidays in our mountains, and the basis for the rise of mountain villages like Berwang to places of longing for guests from near and far. But skiing and ski holidays have experienced a huge change over the last 100 years. That's why we want to compare past and present and take you on a little journey in time.

By the way: The reason why Hotel Singer exists is that its founder - a hotelier's son and the grandpa of Florian Singer - believed in the future of winter tourism based on skiing as early as 1926. And that's why he was looking for a place where he could build a hotel to make this dream come true. Until then, tourism in Tyrol was mainly a summer pursuit.

Aided ascent then – modern mountain lifts now

The first lifts were... nonel Apart from your own muscle power, there was no way to get up the mountain. What we call ski touring today was common practice at the beginnings of skiing. It was the only way one could whizz down the slopes afterwards. Back then, the motto at Hotel Singer was: Anyone who walks up to Hochalm pasture once and skis down is "good". Anyone who manages to do it twice is super sporty!

It was in 1949 that the first lift was built in Berwang: A single chairlift with wooden chairs and wooden supports. Over time, single chairlifts became more and more comfortable and T-bar lifts were built where possible. In 1977, the first double chairlift was built: Today's Almkopfbahn. We've got it quite good today: There are detachable 4-seater and 6-seater lifts, some even with weather protection, childsafe lifts with adjustable conveyor belt, and 10-seater gondolas with individual seats. Times have definitely changed!





Deep snow then – prepared slopes now

Slope preparation didn't exist! Skiers used to whizz down the mountains slope where they wanted. If it hadn't snowed for a while, the "slopes" were quite rugged and hilly. There were no smooth and groomed slopes - but skiing wasn't popular yet. With time, ski instructors started flattening the beginner hills with their skis. After a while, a hand roller with one skier in front and one in the back offered additional help. Only later were snowcats, as we know them today, built and used. Today, the Bergbahnen Berwang lifts have eight state-of-the-art slope machines, three of which are equipped with winches. Every evening the slopes are groomed by a highly trained team until late at night - and once again in the morning in case of heavy snowfall. Snowmaking systems have been used in Berwang since the beginning of the 1990s. Three snowmaking systems that communicate with each other, several pumping stations, spring catchments and a 75,000m³ pond, kilometre-long pipelines and pipe systems, and a total of 60 snow cannons and just as many snow lances guarantee pure skiing fun even in winters with less snow.



Ski school then – snow sports school now

Ski instructors in suit and tie? No, no, not in the evening at the gala event, but on the slope – that was quite normal in the 20s and 30s. Elegant clothes, muted colours, and a stylish haircut – that's how the ski instructors (who, by the way, were exclusively male) used to look like. It's no wonder that many female ski guests would book skiing holidays in Berwang more than once a year – and in many cases they then stayed and lived in the mountains from then on.

Ski instructors used to be more than just teachers; they were real entertainers. Skiing, 5 o'clock tea (or après-ski, as we'd call it today), dinner, partying till the morning hours – ski instructors were there for it all. After all, mainly adult ski students were taught and not necessarily children, as it's mostly the case today.

Teaching was always based on the latest ski curriculum. And we Austrians were always ahead of the times, after all, it was above all the so-called "Arlberg technique" that had shaped skiing in the beginning. Back then, it was always the Austrian ski schools and their curricula that pushed ski technology forward. Today, children in particular learn to ski in a playful way with Bobo the mascot. No complicated explanations, no difficult techniques, just fun and games. And on the second or third day, the little ones can already ride up in the gondola and snowplough down the wide, flat slopes. A great joy for both children AND parents.







Parallel fun then – carving technique now

As exhausting as the ascent used to be, so too was the descent. Long wooden boards were the beginning of skiing. At the end of the 1920s, iron edges were screwed on for a better hold. But since the ski boots were laced leather boots, and the binding was just a strap binding, skiing was still pretty shaky. The outfit was quite different from today's sportswear: Thick wool, loden, wedge trousers were the order of the day. That's certainly also one of the reasons why the high season used to be in March, when the temperatures were finally pleasant again and not freezing cold.

As long as our hotel has existed, so too has skiing technology evolved. And with each development, skiing itself has changed: The turns became shorter, the slopes better prepared, the material more modern and supplemented with plastic skis, sandwich construction, safety bindings, proper ski boots made of hard plastic and soft insides. Skis became more colourful and also shorter, until the carving technique revolutionised the sport at the end of the 1990s. It made skiing easier. It is now easier to make a turn and less experienced skiers can have way more fun.

> For our guests, one thing always remained the same, in 1928 as in 2023: The joy of gliding down the slopes in a landscape covered in deep snow, always framed by the breathtaking nature of Berwang's mountains.

FROM OUR SERIES "THE LOCAL PRODUCERS": Family Falger's farm

Offering our guests the highest quality and the freshest of products are two of the most important criteria when selecting suppliers for our Hotel Singer. But regionality also plays a big role for us. Not only is this more sustainable and supports local businesses, but it also allows us to know the exact origin of our food. That's why we, together with our kitchen team, do everything in our power to source as many top-quality products as possible from our immediate surroundings.



Our closest local supplier is definitely the Falger family from Berwang. Since last winter, we have been sourcing our delicious yoghurt from them, which you have surely already tasted at our breakfast buffet. The farm is currently run by the third generation of the family, but it has been around for much longer. We spoke to Alexander, who joined the family business in 2018 and has now been producing the tasty yoghurt for three years. He gave us an insight into the daily routine on the farm as well as the production of the yoghurt:





Between Berwang and Bichlbach lies the Lähner Alm, where the cows of the Falger family live and graze on lush Alpine pastures in summer. For the family, the day starts at 5 a.m. with mucking out the barn and feeding and milking the cows. When barn time is over at 8 a.m., the cows go outside to pasture; there they spend the whole day before returning to the barn for milking in the evening. In summer, the animals spend the night outside as well.

The milk collected in the mornings and evenings is processed on site three times a week, and not only into the tasty yoghurt we offer you. The milk is also turned into butter, curd, buttermilk or bottled directly as raw milk.



How tasty yoghurt is made from raw milk – we took a closer look at the process and the production:

First, the milk has to be pasteurised, which involves heating it to 90°C for a short time to ensure a longer shelf life. After letting it cool, the yoghurt culture, e.g. lactic acid bacteria that convert lactose into lactic acid, is added. This coagulates the milk and gives it the slightly sour taste so typical of yoghurt. After incubation overnight, the yoghurt is then filled as natural yoghurt in the morning or further processed into one of over ten different other varieties. In addition to classics such as strawberry, stracciatella, and vanilla, there are also more unusual varieties such as poppy & marzipan, toffee, or seasonal specials such as baked apple or plum & cinnamon.

You are also welcome to take a piece of your holiday home with you, as the Falger family's products are also available for purchase. On your way home, simply stop at Landhaus Panorama on the left-hand side before leaving Berwang and help yourself to the self-service fridge. There is a small cash desk on the fridge for paying for your shopping. The products of the Falger family can also be found at lnes Dorfladen in Bichlbach or at Ausserferner Bauernladen in Reutte. Why don't you stop at one of those shops on your way home and take your holiday home?



We look forward to treating you to the tasty products from the Falger family's farm and would like to take this opportunity to thank them very much for the successful cooperation and the delicious yoghurt.


